### Dvar Torah —Parshas Va'era

January 12, 2024

Hashem told the Jewish nation He was going to redeem them from slavery, take them out of Mitzrayim and give them the Torah. The S'forno explains that Hashem guaranteed them that if they thought about the promise and absorbed into their consciousness, they would become worthy of entering Eretz Yisroel. However, because of the heavy burden of slavery and bondage, they were not able to contemplate their redemption. Only their children, the next generation, would enter the Land of Israel.

How could Hashem punish B'nai Yisrael for not contemplating their freedom while in the midst of slavery? Their workload was staggering, and their task-masters were beating them. From where could they have mustered the strength to concentrate on thoughts of redemption? Apparently they did indeed have the ability to appreciate Hashem's promise regardless of their situation. The human mind is capable of greater feats than we give it credit for. Even when the situation is overwhelming, doubled over in pain, they had the potential to concentrate on a foreign idea - freedom!

This is a common strategy of our evil nemesis – the Yetzer Hara. Our enemy is well aware of the powerful effect that contemplation and reflection on our actions can have in fighting him and avoiding sin. He knows if we manage to find even a few moments to think about what we are doing, we will immediately start regretting our misdeeds and eventually abandon them altogether. To prevent this, he keeps us busy with all sorts of responsibilities and constantly distracts us from our true life goals so that we continue in our daily routine unaware of any wrongdoing.

We are busy. Our responsibilities seem endless. Yet, if we set our priorities properly, we will find the time and clarity of mind to study our behavior and appreciate the Torah and it's mitzvot on our way to becoming better Jews.

Our class has mastered the art of summarizing literature, both non-fiction and fiction genres.


In our science class, we learned about what science is and how scientists work. We are currently learning about the anatomy of organisms.


Our students have excelled in various areas of mathematics and we are working on all areas of fractions.
